Who May Enter: Only Edmond Quilt Guild (EQG) members of good standing may enter items into the show. Entries submitted by EQG members must have been made or quilted by a member or a group containing a member of EQG. 2010 EQG membership is required to submit a quilt entry form. 2010 EQG dues must have been paid prior to January 19, 2010 for the member's quilt to be included in the show.

Judging: This is a judged show. Any items that you enter will be judged.

Number of Entries: Members may enter up to five (5) items, using a separate entry form for each item. Please indicate on the form the priority you prefer them to be shown in the event our space is limited. The Quilt Entry Form may be reproduced.

Category Placement: Please indicate on the Quilt Entry Information form which category you would like your item entered in. A list of categories is attached for easy reference. The Quilt Show Committee reserves the right to make the final decision on the quilts entered, category placement, and where quilts will be hung.

Awards: In each category, First, Second and Third place ribbons will be awarded by the judge. First Place in each category will be eligible for Best of Show. Viewers' Choice, Judge's Choice and President Challenge ribbons will also be awarded.

Insurance: Members are responsible for insuring items as desired. Check your homeowner's policy for coverage details.

Quilt Sleeve: ALL quilts (except miniature quilts) must have a 4-inch deep finished sleeve attached to the back of the quilt. The top of the sleeve must be no more than 94" from the bottom of the quilt. Quilts without appropriate sleeves will not be accepted.

Quilt Label: All quilts must have a fabric identification label sewn to the lower right-hand corner of the quilt (as you look at the back). This label must have the member's name and the name of the quilt.

Entry Photos: Color photos of entries must accompany the entry forms. 35mm and high-resolution digital prints will be accepted – no Polaroids. Quilt entry forms and photos will not be returned to the member.

Permission to Photograph: Each quilt entry is required to have a signed Permission to Photograph form, located at the bottom of the Quilt Story form.

Quilt Story: The Quilt Show Committee reserves the right to edit the Quilt Story for length and spelling.

Mail Entry To: For each item entered, a completed single copy of the Quilt Entry Information, Permission to Photograph and Quilt Story, along with a photo of the quilt, should be mailed to:

by May 18, 2010; or they may be given to Alice at the May EQG meeting. **Late entries will not be accepted.**

Quilt Drop-Off: Quilts must be delivered between July 22 and 27, 2010, to either Alice Kellogg (2805 Old Farm Rd., Edmond; 348-2233), Judy Elliott (1309 Copperfield Dr., Edmond; 715-0216), Bonnie Bowman (10281 Sand Plum North, Edmond; 216-0388) or Brenda Esslinger (3428 N.W. 26, OKC; 946-0817). **Safety pin** the Quilt Identification form to the right-hand side of the back of the quilt, just below the sleeve. DO NOT USE STRAIGHT PINS! Entries should be individually placed into a cloth bag, such as a pillowcase, with your name on the outside of the bag in large, readable block letters.

Quilt Pick-Up: Keep the Permission to Pick Up Entered Item form until the close of the show on Saturday. No quilt will be released without this form. Quilts will be available for pick up after 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 31, 2010.

Definitions:

Traditional is the old tried and true patterns.

Innovative is the use of traditional patterns in a new and different way.

example: a landscape made from half-square triangles

Art is an original design.

Professionally Quilted means quilted by someone who is paid to quilt your quilt or someone who is a professional quilter, even if that is you.

Miniature is a full quilt that has been scaled down to 18" square (72") or smaller.

Holiday can be any holiday from Valentine's Day to Christmas and any size.

Juvenile is a quilt made for a baby or child and can be any size.

First time entrant is a person that has never entered a judged quilt show.

President's Challenge will be judged by our own president, Bonnie Bowman

Quilts entered in the 2007 show are ineligible to compete in the 2010 show.

Step 2: Prepare your quilt(s) for the show

- Attach a 4-inch finished sleeve to the back of the quilt
- Attach a fabric identification label to the back of the quilt

Step 3: Turn in your quilt(s)

deadline between July 22 & 26, 2010

- Fill in the Quilt Identification form and attach it to the back of your quilt
- Deliver quilt(s), each in a separate bag, to Alice Kellogg (2805 Old Farm Rd., Edmond; 348-2233), Judy Elliott (1309 Copperfield Dr., Edmond; 715-0216), Bonnie Bowman (10281 Sand Plum North, Edmond; 216-0388) or Brenda Esslinger (3428 N.W. 26, OKC; 946-0817)

Step 4: Pick up your quilt(s)

- Fill out the Permission to Pick Up Entered Item form
- Bring the completed form on Saturday, July 31 after 6:00 p.m. to pick up your quilt(s) and take it/them home

NOTE: Any quilts not picked up by 8:00p.m. Saturday will become the property of the Quilt Show Committee, who will take them home and really enjoy using them!
